
View from Gentle Breeze to the river




View from the plains to the sandy rocks

In front of the rock there is a beautiful tree.




What are these depressions?

The other boys are ready to carry the bricks to their drying place.




The excess clay is removed with a wire.

At the same time the farmers are ploughing.






They plough at double speed.




After, they harrow the rough ground ...

This cart has a decorated yoke.




An ox-cart goes anywhere.



To stand on it is not so easy!




The yokes are simple.

What are the oxen doing in the sand?




They are ploughing!




Ploughing is easy in the sand.
